

Unlimited Dual Officer Training Program



Summary

This training provides the highest possible qualification in the merchant navy, both in deck and engine departments. Graduates are thus eligible to work on all types and sizes of civilian ships. The courses provide comprehensive knowledge and operational skills for future Deck Officers and Engine Officers, with no tonnage or power limitations. This is why the training is called "unlimited and dual-purpose".

After a scientific baccalaureate, I completed four years of study and one year of internship at the French National Maritime Academy in Marseille (ENSM).

Last diploma obtained: DESMM (equivalent to Master's level - EQF Level 7).

The ENMM was formerly called the "Hydrographic School", which earned it the nickname "Hydro". Today, it has been renamed ENSM - École Nationale Supérieure Maritime ([school website](#)).

1999: Obtained the scientific baccalaureate and passed the competitive exam for entry into the 1st class merchant navy officer program.
